Ready and Running: Legacy Landscapes Fund blends international finance for nature-based solutions

Description of objective, content and expected outcomes of the session	<p>Nature-based solutions can provide over one third of the cost-effective climate mitigation needed between now and 2030 to stabilize warming to below 2 °C (PNAS, 2017). While often overlooked, area-based conservation is absolutely critical in strengthening climate resilience.</p> <p>LLF is ready and running as a financial instrument driving nature-based solutions, supported by KfW/BMZ, AFD, and others. Under discussion is how LLF's successes to date illustrate that the climate and the biodiversity crisis can be solved in parallel.</p> <p>We will introduce the fund, examine the rationale of donors, and highlight concrete examples of climate resilience and conservation successes going hand in hand. We will showcase LLF's carbon impact and, using the example of a Namibian site, demonstrate how nature and climate protection are intrinsically linked.</p> <p>The outcome of the section is to strengthen the argument for protected areas as a key component in promoting nature-based solutions and showcase an existing instrument that sustainably funds measures for climate resilience.</p>
